



Awards for Excellence



Difficult Access Category Criteria

Entries in the **Difficult Access** category are judged on the evidence provided on the access solutions to sites with difficult access to one or more areas. There are no limitations on the type of project or contract value with this category.

For your project to be judged in this category photographic evidence of the access solution being used whilst work is being completed needs to be included with your entry.

As most projects have been completed when judging commences, without documented evidence of the below criteria, projects will not be able to be judged.

Entries in the **Difficult Access** category are judged on:

- Safety is considered and maximised for workers and community during the undertaking of the works – photographic evidence is required.
- Imagination of the Access Solution - to enable workers to efficiently and comfortably undertake the works – a complete scope of works and photographic evidence is required to be submitted with your entry.
- The appropriate use of specialised equipment was undertaken in the access solution – details of why the specific equipment was chosen and photographic evidence of the solution used is required.
- That the access solution was conceived and undertaken by the Contractor entering this Award category.

NOTE:

A contractor who is deemed eligible to enter the Awards for Excellence shall be the principal contractor and generally the one who assumes both the risk and liability for the works.

A subcontractor may enter the Awards for Excellence, with the express written permission of both the principal contractor and owner.
